Contest Rules

Eligibility

The First Scot Contest is open to all Canadian residents who are at least eighteen (18) years of age at the time of entry.

To Enter

Submissions will be accepted by email (nbwebportal@bellaliant.net) or by mailing their information to NB Scottish Web Portal Project, PO Box 781 Fredericton NB E3B 5B4. All submissions must contain contact information including name, email address, mailing address and a telephone number. Submissions should also be documented using verifiable sources such as land grants, census records, and information from bibles. Please submit copies only, no originals.

Contest Period

The contest will be open from January 25, 2013 until November 30, 2013. The prize winning submission will be judged and selected in December 2013.

Awarding the Prize

The winning prize will be awarded and announced in December 2013, but up to three (3) entries will be **published in the NB Scottish Journal**.

The Prize

The grand prize for the challenge is a tablet, or \$500.00 in cash.

Person contact information will only be used to administer the contest, and this information will not be published or shared with any third party.
